



History 1922-1926

may be likened to the Golden Age of Queen Elizabeth. From the beginning prosperity has seemed to follow its path in the march through the years.

1922 marked the ascension of the present Senior Class to the throne. Its reign has been most remarkable for its progress and growth. Such a rapid rise and such an astounding building program has not been known since the founding of the college. Not only did the year bring more Freshmen to be enrolled than preceding classes, but during the period the class saw more changes than any other had seen. The increasing number of Freshmen caused the graduates to increase from twenty in 1923 to thirty-two in 1924, to forty-eight in 1925, until in 1926 seventy-one students will receive their degrees in June.

Before and during 1922, plans were being carefully made, weighed and decided upon for a new dormitory that was, to some extent, to relieve the ever-increasing demand that more girls be admitted to the college. In the fall and spring of 1923-1924, under the special supervision of the president, Terrell Annex B was added to the already goodly number of dormitories. This meant that one hundred and twenty more girls could be accommodated than was possible when the class of '26 entered. To complete Terrell Hall and its Annexes, which is probably the largest college dormitory in the state, Terrell Annex C was erected during the summer of 1924.

As England ceased to be called Angle-land, so G. N. & I. C. had taken on the more apropos name of Georgia State College for Women. The class went away one June and returned in September to find that the electric sign over the main walk blazed this fact to the passers-by with a new, resplendent G. S. C. W. Gradually this same walk and its branches were being made smooth by pavement for skaters, pedestrians—and beauty—ending in an imposing gateway that will remain a constant monument of the love of some by-gone class for its Alma Mater.

Until the fall of 1924 no misfortune had marred the smoothness with which the years were passing toward the goal. As no path to true success is clear of obstacles, a seeming calamity fell during the fall term. On December 8, 1924, Main Building burned to the ground. It contained the most valuable records of the college, and much equipment which could only partially be replaced. The President, Registrar, and Bookkeeper, having had their offices in the building were hampered by this loss. All seemed dark and foreboding for a while, but the dauntless spirit of G. S. C. W. awoke to turn misfortune into good fortune. No class will ever feel again such a dynamic force of loyalty, courage, and determination that then held sway over all. Out of the ruins sprang a future of larger and nobler proportions. It was hard with discouraging opposition, but easy with wonderful determination.

No time was lost before reparations were begun. A beautiful classroom building was started in June, 1925, and was in use the next fall. To that is being added the classroom annex which will be completed before the class of '26 leaves. Again this class will lead the way by being the first to graduate in the spacious auditorium that will more than replace the one destroyed by fire.

The college has not only grown in campus equipment but has also taken a

decided step forward in the educational line. In the fall of 1925 the Georgia State College for Women was admitted to the Southern Association of Colleges.

The class of '26 feels that it has lived! Success, misfortune, disappointment, happiness, sadness, failure, triumph, labor, and love have all played their part in the moulding of each girl in the past four years. The leaders labored side by side with the members; together they have made a force that could but add its part to the making of the wonderful era of the college, just as the era and the college have left their stamp on them.

Other classes may come and go but it is hard to believe that any will leave behind a history of four years more teeming with vitality, struggles, hardships, pleasures, and ultimate triumphs. Ever so tender associations will linger around these years as a sacred halo for the class of '26. It has been their age, their era, in a book of history upon whose pages will be written deeds, lives, and advances unexcelled.

The campus life is made more pleasant because of the wholesome pleasure that


is offered.
