Ben W. Howell

U.S. Army Sergeant First
Class Ben Willis Howell was born
in Tennille, Georgia in
Washington County on July 5,
1931. Records from
HonorStates.org show that Sgt.
First Class Howell enlisted in the
United States Army. According to
the Union-Recorder, at the time of
his death he had already served 18
years, and was described as a
"career soldier."



On the home front Howell married Carolyn Garrett, of Milledgeville. They had three children: "one son, Ben Keith; two daughters, Kathy Elizabeth and Gwynell Ann," according to the *Union-Recorder*. Records show the family lived at 244 Park Ave. Milledgeville, Ga 31061.

During his final tour of duty in Vietnam, which began on April 13, 1968, Howell suffered a "traumatic event." Records show he was killed by hostile small arms fire while in Quang Tri Province. He died on May 28, 1968.

His body would not return to his hometown of Milledgeville for burial until mid-June. A front page article in the *Union-Recorder*, reported the funeral for Howell was held at 4 p.m. on Monday, June 10 in the Church of the First Assembly of God on Irwinton Road. Howell

was given "full military honors" during a graveside service at the Zeeta Cemetery in Tennille. The funeral was presided over by the Rev. D.W. Gatlyn and Rev. Billy R. Jones.

In addition to his wife and three children, Howell was survived by his father, Oscar Howell of Dublin, along with his brothers -- M.S. Howell of Tennille, Remus Howell of Swainsboro, and Melvin Howell of Sandersville -- and his five sisters: Mrs. Velvin Smith of Tennille, Mrs. Margaret West of Savannah, Mrs. W.O. Bland of Brunswick, Mrs. J.D. Walker of Longview, Texas, and Mrs. Paul Throade of California.

Funeral Held For Victim Of Viet Nam War

Funeral services for SFC Ben W. Howell, 36-year-old victim of the Vietnam War, were held at 4 p.m. Monday in the church of the First Assembly of God on Irwinton Road, with full military honors accorded at the graveside.

The Rev. Billy R. Jones and the Rev. D.W. Gatlyn officiated and burial was in Zeeta Cemetery in Tennille.

SFC Howell, a career soldier had been in the United States Army 18 years. He was killed in action May 28 and his body reached Milledge-ville last Saturday.
