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


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Emory Prof Farrante & Teicher Community Chorus To To Perform At GC Organize For Season To Speak

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CGA Announcement

The following is presently before faculty-council for approval. Next Tuesday it will be put up before you (the students) at the Senate Elections for your reactions:

Whereas, there is no definite statement in the Board of Regents policies concerning the use or possession of alcoholic beverages on college property or at college sponsored events, the Executive Council of the Georgia College Government Association is requesting a rule change in the Student Code.

Whereas, the Georgia College Government Association feels that many students do approve of such a rules change and there are provisions in the changes to protect the rights of those who do not engage in the use of alchoholic beverages, we, the Executive Council of the Georgia College Government Association, strongly support such

Whereas Section A. Article 2 of the Code Governing Student Rights. Responsibilities and Discipline at Georgia College states, "The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages on college property or at events sponsored or supervised by the college is prohibited.", we the Executive Council are requesting that the above mentioned article be changed to read as follows:

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

A. Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages by any any student under the age of eighteen (18) is strictly prohibited.

B. Any purchase and sale of alcoholic beverages on college property is prohibited. C. Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in private


living quarters is not prohibited, provided that each participant is at least eighteen (18) years of age. D. Consumption or display of alcoholic beverages is strictly

prohibited in non-private areas of residence halls such as lobbies. recreation areas, lounges, or baths.

E. Consumption or display of alcoholic beverages is strictly prohibited in any academic buildings.

F. Consumption or display of alcoholic beverages is strictly prohibited in the College Union Building except in cases of social events in which the membership of that organization does not prohibit the use of alcoholic beverages.

G. Alcoholic beverages may be prohibited from any college sponsored event by a statement from the membership of the organization, Continued on Page 4:

The Value Of The GC Identification Card

Many people do not realize the potential value of their I.D. card. Many students think that the I.D. card is an idealized picture with a signature that proves "they are, who they are." They also think that the I.D. card is a "symbol of membership" to Georgia College. These people are right. The I.D. card is purposeful for the above reasons, but those reasons are not the only ones.

Georgia College sponsors many extra-curricular activities. These activities are generally free, but, occasionally there is a very small admission fee. The only requirement for admission is the small fee and the I.D. card. Well, you know that you are a G.C. student with every right to attend the activity, but the ticket man at the gate does not know this fact. To be on the safe side, you must present your I.D. Card to the man.

Almost any special activity in the College Union will require your I.D. card. If you play ping -pong or pool, you must present your I.D., along with a small fee, at the information desk. In return you are given permission to play these games. There are other activities within the College Union that will require your I.D. card.

One of the main pruposes of the I.D. card is for the cafeteria. You must have your I.D. card handy with your meal ticket when going though the lunch line. This requirement prevents anyone else from using your meal ticket.

In many P.E. courses, you will find that your I.D. card is necessary to check out college athletic equipment at the "Cage" in the P.E. building. You will need your I.D. card to get in a G.C. Colonials basketball, soccer, and baseball game. The I.D. card is a necessity at any college sponsored dance, concert, and movie. Many music and art series shows and exhibitions will require an I.D. card for your ad-

All of the activities at G.C. are for the benefit and progress of the student. Please carry your I.D. card to any college activity for your own benefit.
