Letter From CGA President

Dear Student Body:

During the few weeks after my election as President of the College Government Association, I heard many pleaing cries of the G.C. students--the loudest being "change, change. . .we want few personal comments. I think it something changed around here." Well my friends, in trying to fulfill our duties as officers of CGA, the Executive Council has initiated several proposals for change. But to our bewilderment we find that no one has enough iniative to help effect these Georgia College, now or for its changes.

The one specific example that I have in mind is the recent decision of Fall Retreat to reconstruct Slipper into a unified production. We voted in a democratic manner to CHANGE Slipper. But since the decision, all I have heard is a jumbled confusion which, I suppose, is to no mention whatsoever of a be defined as opposition to majority vote. When was the last change Slipper. They are the ones who will be given the chance to alter the original decision-so if you have a definite feeling about Slipper, let one of these representatives know about it.

We will be meeting on October 16th at 7:00 p.m. But I must make it perfectly clear that this will be the final decision and whatever is decided, then will stick.

I cannot end without stating a is sad to see the G.C. students who 'love' Slipper so much kill it. Yes, I feel that Slipper in all its past grandeur is dead. Change is inevitable for Georgia College. We're all being selfish and thinking of only what is best for future.

I also think it is the height of impassiveness when people complain of the Fall Retreat vote not being a majority vote. Well, my acutely aware friend, if you would take time to actually read the Student Handbook and the CGA Constitution you would find time you read your handbook? Don't you think it's about time? Only two or three people have taken the time to show their interest by personally talking with me about their displeasure. If you, are going to take the energy to beef, why not do it to someone who can do something about it? To you, the so-called new generation of Georgia College students, I offer this final cry--if change is what you've cried, stick by your guns and cry louder, or don't attempt to whimper. Change takes guts--it's a challenge that takes work and enthusiasm-when was the last time you thought of yourself as a coward?!

GC Participates In Georgia

Intern Program

Georgia College is a participant in the Georgia Intern Program. The Intern Program provides an opportunity for interested students to earn up to 15 quarter hours toward their degree by working in a government agency in Georgia. All students at Georgia College are eligible to participate in the Intern Program. Financial stipends of about \$600 a quarter will be awarded to all interns.

Applications are now being received from students who are interested in being an intern for winter guarter, 1973. Application forms are available in the Academic Dean's office, Parks 102. The deadline for returning the applications to the Dean's Office is October 27. Intern positions are available in the following areas of interest: Health, Law Enforcement, Planning, Education, Social Work, Ecology, Economic Development, and similar areas. All applicants will be notified by December 1 if they have been accepted into the winter program.






