



-To validate the authenticity of black gospel music -To be in ministry to black college youth -To build models of worship that will transform temporary


emotion into permanent motion -To strengthen the bond between the black campus and the black

To amend an Act providing for license and excise taxes upon the business of dealing in malt beverages and for other purposes, approved March 23, 1935 (Ga. Laws 1935, p. 73), as amended, particularly by an Act approved March 30, 1937 (Ga. Laws 1937, p. 148), so as to change the provisions relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages on a college campus; to amend an Act known as the "Revenue Tax Act to Legalize and Control Alcoholic Beverages and Liquors", approved February 3, 1938 (Ga. Laws 1937-38, Ex. Sess., p. 103), as amended, so as to change the provisions relating to the operation of businesses involving alcoholic beverages within certain distances of a college campus; to amend an Act prohibiting the sale of wine or beer near schools, approved March 9, 1945 (Ga. Laws 1945, p. 447), so as to clarify the definition of the word "school"; to provide

Section 2. An Act known as the 'Revenue Tax Act to Legalize and Control Alcoholic Beverages and Liquors", approved February 3, 1938 (Ga. Laws 1937-38, Ex. Sess., p. 103), as amended, is hereby further amended by striking from subsection (c) of Section 9 the following paragraph:




