In the process of learning to extract information concerning the social history of a patient, Thurmond also had the opportunity to check with ward personnel about current behavior and conduct a structured interview with patients. By the end of his quarter at CSH, he was able to "put it all together" and write a report and present his impressions and recommendations on a number of patients.

For his clinical experiences at CSH, the GC senior last quarter earned five hours of academic credit at the college, joining several GC students who earned practicum credit before him.

According to Dr. Robert W. Wildman, chief clinical psychologist at the hospital and associate professor of psychology at the college, students in the program are enthusiastic over the opportunity to mesh

Black History

This week the BSA is introducing Melvin J. Chisum, a pioneer newsman, to the student

Melvin Chisum is one of the most energetic and enterprising of the black newsmen of the period from 1912 to his death in the late 1940's. In his lifetime career he established and published "The Tribune" in Oklahoma City; it was the roerunner of the "Black Dispatch" which is still in operation in that city...

He carried out several investigations to uncover corruption or policies which seemed to reflect discredit on Blacks. In 1915 the target was Langston University, then the only state institution of high education in Oklahoma which Blacks could attend. In 1926 he conducted an investigation of the Tuskegee (Alabama) Veteran's Hospital which exposed a situation that had involved factionalism, unethical conduct of some staff personnel, and inefficiency (if not actual misconduct) in the handling of funds. He was a versatile man who enjoyed a wide acquaintance with leading educators.

We cannot relate anecdotes and human interests in detail of this great man because we lack the information, but his work, "The Tribune" is facts.
